Mission Statement

The Moapa Valley Empowerment High School Community prepares students for post-secondary education, careers of their choice, and to excel as productive, responsible citizens.

Principal's Highlights

Moapa Valley Empowerment HS is dedicated to providing our students with an exceptional academic program. We offer a warm and caring environment with a knowledgeable, talented, and friendly staff.

- Moapa Valley Empowerment High School is home to the only Agri-Culinary Enterprise Farm in the state of Nevada.
- The 4 x 4 block schedule allows students the opportunity to complete 32 credits, thus increasing the graduation rate.
- The Post-Secondary Pirate program allows juniors and seniors to take CSN courses on the campus of MVHS.
- Approximately 35% of juniors and seniors are enrolled in at least one CSN course.
- The first time pass rate on the math NHSPE was higher than all other CCSD comprehensive high schools at 71.9%.
- MVHS is the only comprehensive CCSD high school to make Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) for 7 consecutive years.
- MVHS exceeded the CCSD standard with 82.1% of students graduating.
- Seventy-five percent (75%) of MVHS students participate in one or more extracurricular activities.
- Empowerment funding allowed us to maintain the block schedule and six licensed positions.

Goals and Objectives

Goal 1

Students at MVHS will show an increase in mathematics, science, and ELA achievement on the spring 2009-2010 NHSPE.

Objective(s):

All subgroups in mathematics, science, and ELA will decrease in the percentage of non-proficient students by 10% on the March 2010 Nevada High School Proficiency Exams.

Goal 2

The percentage of Moapa Valley High School graduates choosing a two or four year college or university will increase.

Objective(s):

The percentage of MVHS graduates enrolling in a two or four year college or university will increase by 5%.

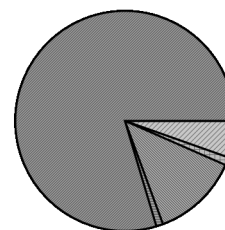

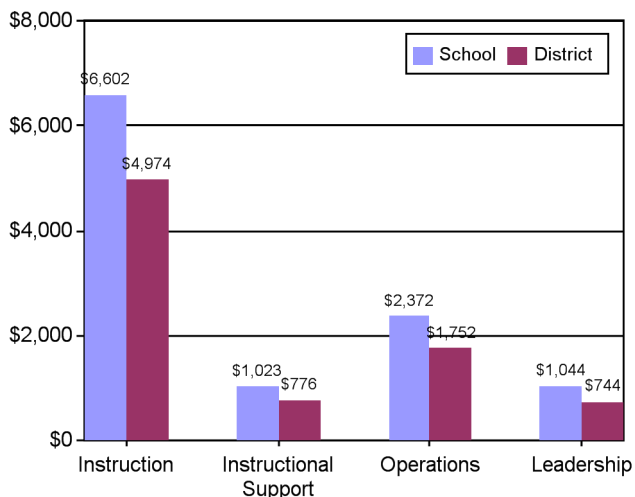
